

~~~ CAMPING RULES ~~~

Camping is available at the Mercer County Fair for a charge of **\$120 PER UNIT**. In addition, fair pass rates will also apply for all individuals' admittance in and out of the fair residing in the camper. Reservations may be paid to the Mercer County Agriculture Society/Mercer County Fairgrounds, 1001 West Market Street, P.O. Box 301, Celina, OH 45822, beginning the first day of the fair for the following fair year. Please indicate "Fair Camping" on your check. Payment in full of \$120 is your reservation for the week of the fair. **ANY CAMPER NOT PAID IN FULL BY DECEMBER 15, WILL FORFEIT THEIR RESERVATION. NO EXCEPTIONS.** Campers wishing to be placed on the waiting list can notify the Mercer County Fairgrounds through the secretary's office located on the grounds at the above address or may phone 419-586-3239. 1. A Camping Permit must be obtained prior to occupying a camping lot. All lots are non-transferable with a waiting list provided at the secretary's office. Person or persons responsible for said permit must be 18 years of age at the time of purchase and is responsible/liable for the behavior and welfare of all members residing in the unit. An adult camper must accompany any camper under 18 years of age. All those residing at the camper must be registered on the permit. Any person found in the unit after curfew, not registered, is cause for removal of the entire unit. Failure to use assigned campsite or transfer site without written approval will result in loss of camping privileges up to and including forfeiture of your site.
 2. A Camping Permit Display Pass, along with Camping Vehicle Passes, will be provided upon return and completion of the Fair Camping Permit. **The Camping Permit Display Pass will need to be displayed on your unit in a prominent location visible from the roadway side. Vehicle permits will need to hang from rearview mirrors, if possible, or visible in a prominent location.**
 3. Trailers, campers, trucks or any other vehicles used for living purposes or otherwise during the fair, must be parked in **designated areas only**. All camping units, along with two vehicles, must stay within the lot size and marked lines that have been provided. Every attempt will be made to accommodate campers and two driving vehicles at the site. However, due to limited site size based on accommodations, lot placement, location of site with electric poles and electric boxes, tree locations, size of campers and size of vehicles parked at the site, etc., not all sites can accommodate two vehicles. It is the camper's responsibility to see that only your vehicles are parked in your restricted site area. Non-compliance can be reported to the secretary's office or any Fairboard Director and can result in forfeiture of all reserved parking privileges. Camping units may not protrude into the driveway. Any camper that has outgrown their width and length provided site accommodations, will need to be reviewed by the Camping Committee for relocation.
 4. All properly tagged vehicles approved to accompany the campsite will have designated reserved parking for **overflow** that can be used if necessary, but it will not be provided at your site. **All camping unit vehicles must park in these designated areas only! Questions can be addressed with a Parking and Camping Committee Directors.**
 5. The fairboard reserves the right to take from or add too any area that they might need to use in order to make improvements to existing conditions. If this occurs, campers will be notified 30 days in advance of the improvements.
 6. Horseshoe or square groups of campers will not be permitted under any circumstances.
 7. Electric hookups are to be with proper receptacles only, with only **ONE**
- HOOKUP PER CAMPING UNIT! Cords must be UL approved HEAVY DUTY GROUND 3 WIRE CORDS.**
8. Picnic tables are provided on a limited first come, first served basis at the time of site occupancy. Tables are not reserved and not to be chained prior to fair. Due to limited supply, one per lot.
 9. There will be a 12 a.m. (midnight) curfew for all people on the fairgrounds, unless engaged in essential work sanctioned by the Mercer County Agriculture Society/Mercer County Fairboard or Mercer County Sheriff's Office. All music, loud noise, abusive language, large parties, hazardous activities or any other disturbances and annoyances will not be tolerated and must stop at the curfew time. All violators will be dealt with on an individual bases and subject to removal.
 10. Firearms, potentially dangerous or hazardous equipment and hazardous substances will not be allowed on the grounds.
 11. Trash must be put in proper containers located on the grounds and debris removed from you campsite following the fair. If the site is not clean, you will be charged for trash removal and forfeit your site for the following year.
 12. Open fires are prohibited at all times. There will be no cooking out of the camping unit except in containers designed for such use.
 13. Water and sewage will not be allowed to be discharged on the ground and is subject to \$100 fine. A Dump Station is located north of Camping Lot "C," on the northwest corner of the fairgrounds. Portable dump station removal is available upon request at the secretary's office at fees established by the provider. Removal is by request only at times designated by the supplier.
 14. **No animals** are permitted in the camping area.
 15. Absolutely **NO** Auxiliary Motorized Vehicles, ATV's, Golf Carts, Rollerblades, Skateboards, Bicycles, Scooters, etc., except those designated by the Mercer County Fairboard, are allowed on the grounds at any time during the fair. Exclusions for handicapped wheeled apparatuses and fair business only by permission from the secretary's office/Mercer County Fairboard.
 16. Alcohol is permitted in designated areas only sanctioned by the Mercer County Agriculture Society/Mercer County Fairboard. No alcoholic beverages in areas outside of camping units. In agreement with the Ohio State Law, alcoholic consumption will not be permitted under the age of 21.
 17. Any disturbances requiring the intervention of the Mercer County Sheriff's Office will, **AFTER ONE WARNING**, constitute reason for dismissal from the grounds and loss of camping privileges.
 18. All the same rules apply for primitive camping with exception to the use of generators. **Generators will be allowed on primitive campsites only. However, quiet time will be from 12 a.m. to 7 p.m.** Please be conscientious of your neighbors.

~~~ HORSE TRAILER PARKING RULES ~~~

1. Trailers must be parked in designated parking spots. No other vehicles are permitted to park in this area for any reason.
2. Registration is available at the MCA Secretary's Office.
3. There will not be a charge for trailers used solely for storage of tack, feed, or as a dressing room.
4. Any trailer used for camping will be charged a \$40 camping fee. Electric and vehicle parking will not be available in this area. Any trailer needing electric and parking passes must have a spot in one of the regular camping lots.
5. Any trailer used as a camper must comply with the camping rules.
6. Anyone violating the rules will be notified by the Mercer County Agricultural Society. If the violator fails to comply with the rules, the violator will be fined \$50. Fines must be paid prior to entry of the next years fair in order to participate during the fair.
